



LOCALE COLLECTION POLICY

The purpose of locale is to serve as a dissemination and archival repository for collections of materials created by members of the Cornell and Mann Library communities. These collections and their contents have not been commercially published and are therefore difficult to locate. The collections in locale each have their own unique identities. locale ensures long-term access not only for Cornell but for the public as a whole.

SCOPE

The subject matter of the collections archived in locale will fit within the scope of Mann Library's collection policies. Mann subject areas include: Life Sciences & Agriculture, Nutrition & Food Science, Environmental Sciences, Human Ecology and Business & Applied Social Sciences

ACCESS AND USE

Nearly all items in locale are open access i.e. any member of the public is free to view, download or print materials from locale. The reproduction of some materials may be restricted by terms of copyright or licensing agreements. Transmission or reproduction of protected items beyond that allowed by fair use requires the written permission of the copyright owners.

TYPES OF MATERIAL

Types of material may include, but not be limited to:

- 1) Conference papers, presentations or digital posters
- 2) Issues of a journal, magazine or newspaper
- 3) Technical or project reports
- 4) Books or book chapters

- Publications of academic or organizations

- Commercially owned collections
- Dissertations
- Datasets
- Items not in digital format
